This is the eighth-grade final exam from 1895 in Salina, Kansas, USA It was taken from the original document on file at the Smokey Valley Genealogical Society and Library in Salina, and reprinted by the Salina Journal.

8th Grade Final Exam: Salina, KS - 1895

Grammar (Time, one hour)


- 1. Give nine rules for the use of capital letters.
- 2. Name the parts of speech and define those that have no modifications.
- 3. Define verse, stanza and paragraph.
- 4. What are the principal parts of a verb? Give principal parts of 'lie,' 'play,' and 'run'.
- 5. Define case; illustrate each case.
- 6 What is punctuation? Give rules for principal marks of punctuation.
- 7 10. Write a composition of about 150 words and show therein that you understand the practical use of the rules of grammar.

Arithmetic (Time,1 hour 15 minutes)

- 9. What is the cost of a square farm at \$15 per acre, the distance of which is 640 rods?
- 10. Write a Bank Check, a Promissory Note, and a Receipt.
